
Dr. Robert Josse Nominating

OC-CaMos 2009 Fellowship Award &CaMos



Osteoporosis Canada and the Canadian Multicentre Osteoporosis Study (CaMos) are very pleased to announce a new partnership which will provide a fellowship award for a trainee to pursue research with CaMos.

The Osteoporosis Canada-CaMos Fellowship Award will provide funds for a graduate student or postdoctoral fellow to pursue research training with the investigators at CaMos. The award will contribute to new insights into osteoporosis and provide a foundation for a career in clinical/epidemiologic research related to osteoporosis. This joint venture is an exciting new initiative that furthers the goals of both organizations in that each are committed to optimizing the prevention and treatment of osteoporosis and improving the lives of individuals with this disorder.

The deadline for submission of applications was last May 15th, 2009. Four volunteers from the SAC Research Committee, namely Dr. David Hanley, Dr. David Goltzman, Dr. Sophie Jamal and Dr. Lora Giangregorio, formed an application working group to do the review.

The recipient of the award will be announced shortly.



OC-CIHR New Investigator Award



The Canadian Institutes of Health Research, in partnership with Osteoporosis Canada, is awarding the Fall 2008 New Investigator Award in the Area of Osteoporosis to Dr. Laura E. Targownik of the Human Ecology-Faculty of Medicine, University of Manitoba. Dr. Targownik's research will focus on the "Delineation of the Relationships Between Proton Pump Inhibitor (PPI) Use and the Development of Osteoporosis and Osteoporosis Related Fractures". The research funding will be for five years, non-renewable.

Applications from two other candidates have been approved in open competition-Dr. Suzanne M. Cadarette from the University of Toronto and Dr. Brent Richards from McGill University. Dr. Cadarette's research project is entitled "Improving Medication Use, Health Care and Quality of Life Through Innovative Health Outcomes Research". Dr. Richards, on the other hand, will work on "The Genetic Epidemiology of Osteoporotic Fractures; From Susceptibility Genes to Susceptibility Populations".

Progress of all three research projects will be featured in the SAC Link-Research Edition come October 2009. In the meantime, Osteoporosis Canada will send letters of recognition to the research awardees accompanied by the grant recipient package that highlight the responsibilities of OC and the recipient toward one another. Starting this year, OC will be more aggressive in requesting recipients to add the OC website link in all publications related to the project.

Targeting Osteoporosis and Fractures 2009 Best Practices Paper Update

May 1-2, 2009. Toronto.

The Best Practices Working Group, led by Dr. Alexandra Papaioannou and Dr. Bill Leslie, convened to continue their work in developing the paper on osteoporosis risk assessment and therapies.

Project Status:

- Letters introducing the project were already sent to the different stakeholder organizations. Written replies have been received from the Canadian Association of Radiologists (CAR) and the Society of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists of Canada (SOGC).
- 2. During the meeting, the group was divided into two sections: the therapies group and the risk assessment group. The therapies group worked on the table of contents, including introduction which will cover definitions, statistics and care gaps. The risk assessment group worked on the evidence table and recommendations.
- Documents from both groups will be incorporated into 3. one paper.

To ensure that the final paper is delivered on time, two meetings are scheduled in September and November 2009.
